




Wednesday




Friday

Before reading

Talk together

Look at the cover. Ask: *Do you think the boy's dad can do a handstand, too?*

Story words

These words may be challenging but they are important for the story. Read them together and talk about what they mean.

play – to use a musical instrument (p3), or to have fun (p9)

honk – the loud sound that a horn makes (p12)

catch – to grab something that is flying through the air (p13, 16)

After reading

- Invite your child to retell the story in their own words. Encourage them to look back at the pictures if they need to and prompt them if necessary.
- Look at the picture on p4 and ask: *Why do you think Dad is holding his ears?* (Answer: e.g. because the drum is too loud.)
- Read p8 of the story again. Ask: *Why is Zac 'the best'?* (Answer: e.g. because Zac won the game.)
- Look at the pictures on p16 and ask: *How do you think Zac feels about his dad at the end of the story?*
