Sound of the Week – ‘ay’

The sound we are going to be using this week is the ‘ay’ sound, that can be found in the word ‘pray’.

Week 5 spellings: say, day, May, clay, pray, tray, stay, spray, crayon, prayer, Monday.

Roald Dahl books, Horrid Henry, Princess Mirrorbelle, Fairy tales and David Walliams books are a few examples to use or pick a book you enjoyed as a child.

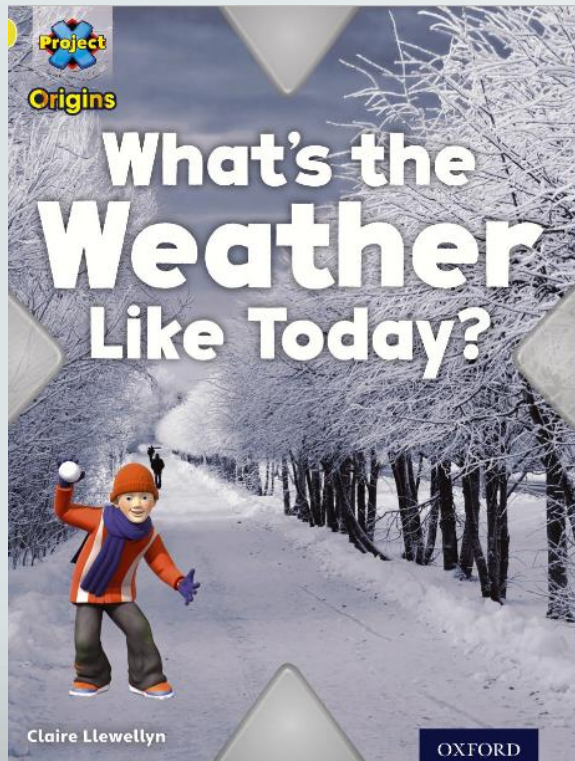

After reading

Talk with your child about the book. Here are some questions you could ask:

- What kind of weather do you like best? Why?
- What can you do to have fun even when it is rainy?

Encourage your child to read the book again. This will build their reading confidence and reading fluency.

Other things to do

Keep talking about this book.

Sing some weather rhymes together, such as ‘Incy Wincy Spider’ or ‘It’s raining, it’s pouring’.

Prayer of the Week

Read this lovely prayer called '**Hail Mary**'.

May is the month of Mary so this prayer is very special to her.

Try to read it every day and see how much you can remember by the end of the week!

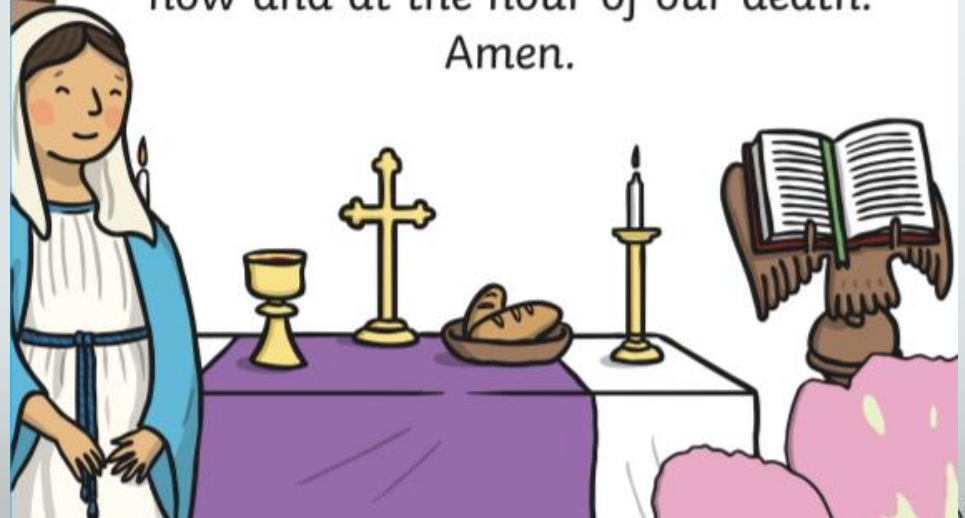
Hail Mary




Acrostic Poem about May
