## The Haunted House


Today we will look at this Haunted House! You will be drawing this house and following the instructions on the next slide!



## The Haunted House – Drawing instructions

- Slates are put on the roof to keep water out. Finish drawing the slates on the roof.
- Windows are made of glass to let the light through. Draw cracks in the windows.
- Shutters are made of wood and stop light from entering. Draw one shutter, hanging off.
- Plastic is often used for window frames because it does not rot. Colour the frames red.

- The walls are plastered grey. Draw a crack from the ground floor to the roof.
- 5. The steps are made of wood. Wood is flat and smooth. Draw green slime on the steps.



- 7. Draw a ghost on the metal balcony on the top floor.
- Draw a chimney on the roof above the balcony.
   Draw smoke coming from the chimney.
- The gutters collect rainwater from the roof. Draw clouds and rain in the sky.
- Draw a red handle on one door and a green knob on the other door. Colour the doors black.


#### What is a habitat?






underground sett tunnels regularly bedding chambers entrances

Badgers live in an underground home called a sett. Badgers use their very strong claws to dig out the tunnels for the sett. They build the sett in a hedge, cave or woodland. The sett will have many different entrances.



Badgers live in the sett all year round. They are very tidy and keep their home clean. They use grass for their bedding and change it regularly. They even have an outside toilet.

A family of about twenty badgers can live in one sett, but it is usually home to about five or six badgers. A sett is often used by badger parents, grandparents and great-grandparents. As more baby badgers (cubs) are born, more tunnels are dug. If too many tunnels are dug, the sett's roof falls in.



The biggest sett ever found in Ireland had 250 metres of tunnels and twenty-five sleeping chambers (bedrooms). Most setts are a lot smaller than this. This plan shows a large sett in Co. Limerick. It had lots of tunnels and sleeping chambers.
