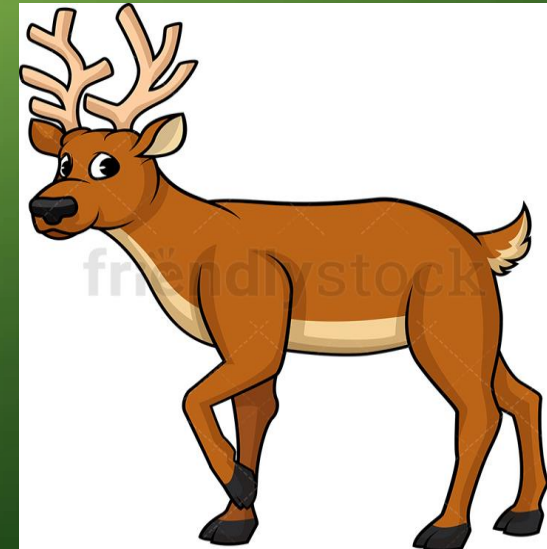
MONDAY: NEWS

TUESDAY: PHONICS

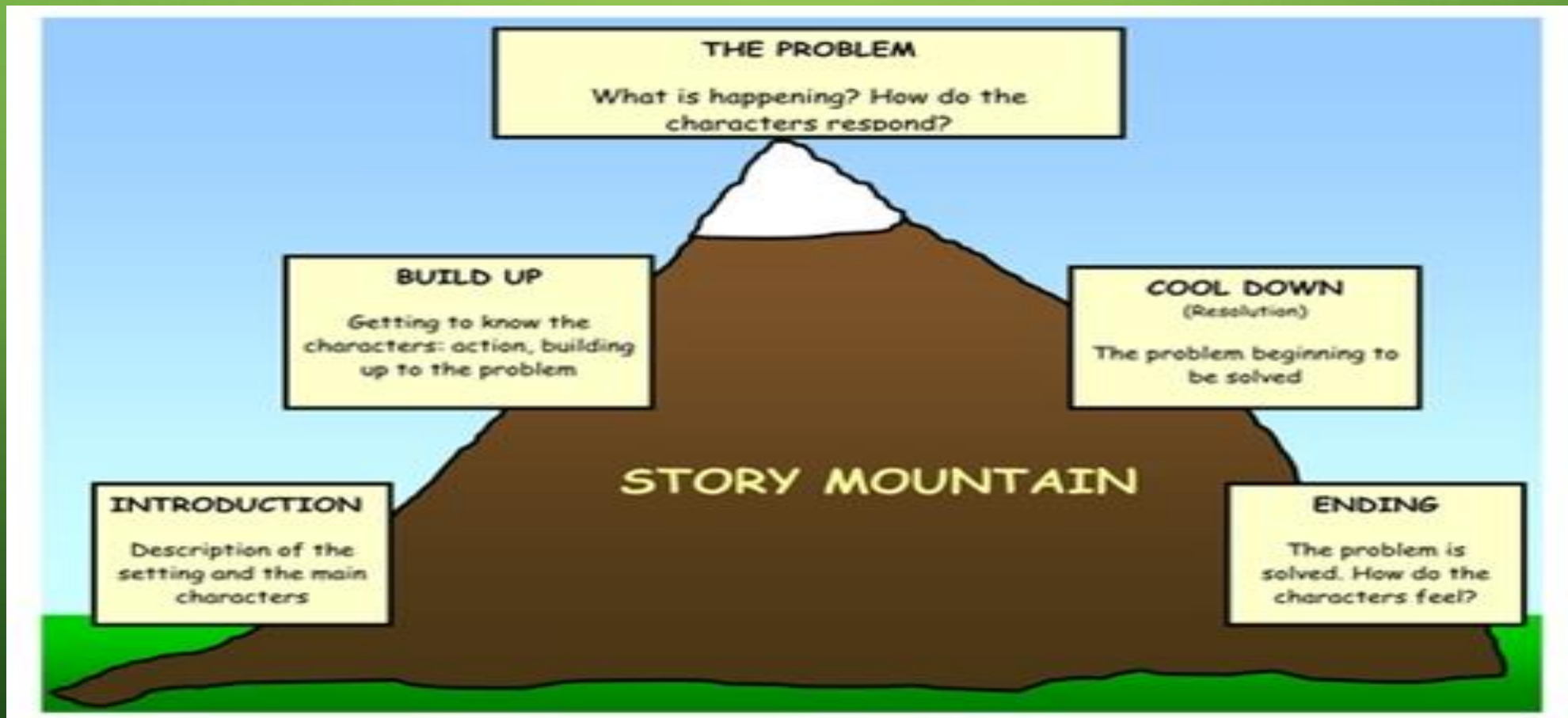

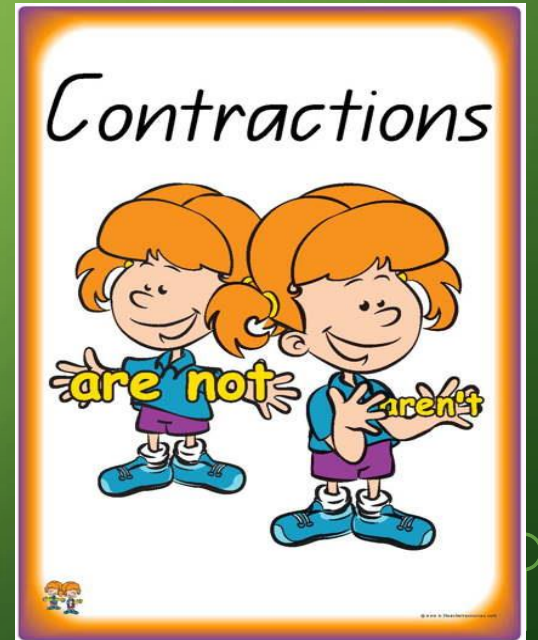


Story Problems

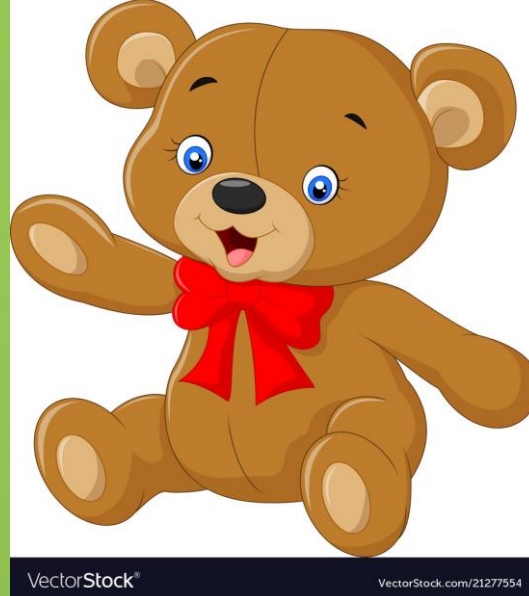

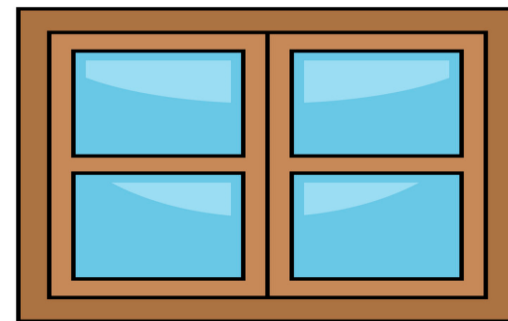
