S.T.E.M. activities


This week we are going to try some S.T.E.M activities which incorporates Science, Technology, Engineering & Maths in a fun and playful way. These activities involve both indoor and outdoor play.





Activity 1: Worry Box Monster

- This great activity incorporates **wellbeing** and **S.T.E.M.** It will hold the worries your child might have during these challenging times.
- **Think:** Think about what recyclable materials you have at home. How can you put them together to create a worry box monster?
- **Test:** Test out your creation. Can you place your folded piece of paper inside? What adjustments can you make?
- **Reflect:** How well does your worry box work? Are you happy with how it looks? Can I get an adult or older brother or sister to help me write my worries down?

My Worry Monster

If you sometimes worry about things like Milton, you may like to make your own worry monster.

Worry monsters are great because they read your worries and munch them up so you no longer need to worry about them!

Follow the instructions below, write down your worry on a piece of paper and put it in your worry monster.

You will need:

- A disposable drinking cup
- Coloured paper/felt
- Pipe cleaners
- Googly eyes
- Pom-poms
- Sticky tape
- Scissors
- Glue

Instructions

1. Take your drinking cup and cut some coloured paper or felt to fit around the outside of the cup. Use the glue to stick this down.
2. Stick googly eyes (or draw your own!) onto the front of the cup. It can look as crazy as you like!
3. You may wish to add pipe cleaner antennae, a monster mouth, a pom-pom nose or anything else you want.
4. Write any worries that you have on a piece of paper and feed it to your monster! If you want to, you could talk to a friend or a member of your family about the worry.


Activity 2: Wind Powered Maze Challenge

- **Challenge:** Design and Create a maze using materials you have at home, e.g. Lego, linking cubes or playdough, a marble/small ball and straws.
- **Think:** What material have you at home that you can use to design and create a maze?
- **Test:** Using a straw get your child to navigate a marble or small ball through the maze.
- **Reflect:** Could you put obstacles in the way? Could you also set up two mazes and have a race with a family member?





Activity 3: Chalk Walk STEM Challenge




- **Challenge:** This challenge (design and draw a chalk walk) requires one material only; thick chalk! It allows you to look at shapes in Maths, design and make something, play and be physically active. Let's hope it's nice and sunny too!
- **Think and Draw:** Decide what kind of outdoor chalk walk you might like to design a make? For example, could you design a town? Could you design a Maths task for your older siblings? Could you make a game? Perhaps twister could be good?
- **Test:** Can you get your brothers, sisters, family members or neighbours to use your chalk walk or game when out for some fresh air?
- **Reflect:** Did you enjoy your chalk walk, maths challenges, game, hopscotch? How could you change it to make it harder? What could you add in or take out?
- **On the next slide there are some examples to help you get creative!**





Activity 4: Balloon STEM Challenge

- **Challenge:** Create games using balloons of different sizes.
- **Think:** What games could you make using a balloon and materials you have at home? For example, balloon tennis, balloon swingball, balloon keepiupes...
- **Test:** How can you make a racket using recyclable materials at home? Can you play your game indoors and outdoors?
- **Reflect:** Can you play the game on your own? How can you keep scores? Are there rules in your game? Can you play this game with your brothers and sisters?





Activity 5: Shadow Drawing Activities

Challenge: To trace a shadow of your favourite toys outside.

What you will need: markers, pencils, paper, favourite toys to draw

Instructions:

1. Place toys near the paper
2. Trace the shadow
3. Enjoy your masterpiece!
4. Watch the video for some more ideas!


