

Playgrounds and beaches are starting to re-open now, which can be really exciting. Talk about both of the pictures. What can you do in these spaces?






- Think about a time when you visited the playground or the beach. Who was with you? What did you do? Did you bring snacks or a picnic?





The Life Cycle of a Butterfly

- A butterfly lays eggs on a leaf or the stem of a plant.
- The caterpillar eats its way out of the egg.
- They eat lots of leaves to help them grow. As they get bigger, they shed some of their skin.
- When the caterpillar has grown to its full size, it will make a chrysalis.
- You cannot see the caterpillar inside the chrysalis. When it is inside the chrysalis, the caterpillar begins to change into a butterfly.
- When the caterpillar has changed into a butterfly, it will break out of the chrysalis.
- The butterfly's wings will be wet and first. Once their wings dry they can begin to fly around.


The Life Cycle of a Butterfly




Life Cycle of a Butterfly Writing Activity

Don't forget you will also need glue or sticky tape as well as the materials shown in each picture.








Water Safety






- When we go swimming in a pool or the sea, we must be very careful.
 There are rules that we need to follow to keep ourselves and others safe.
- Here are some rules to talk about with someone at home;
 - · Make sure when you are swimming, a parent or a trusted adult is nearby.
 - Eat at least one hour before swimming, never eat when you are in the pool or sea.
 - Make sure you are at the correct depth, and use arm bands or a floated ring if you need to!
 - Always ask an adult's permission to go swimming especially in ponds, lakes or the sea.
 - Check to see if a lifeguard is near!
 - Avoid splashing at people in case they don't like it.
 - Don't push people into or under the water.

Look at the picture and talk about what you can see. Remember your water safety rules!
